For finding shelter:

- Use of drugs/alchol
- Pregnancy
- Medication
- Psychological complaints
- · ... and more

Privacy sensitive information

Challenges?

- Little awareness on how data is collected
- Demand for more information from Rapporteur
- Other organizations want information
- Lots of information is unknown
- Privacy

"I came to the Netherlands to earn an income.

I worked 16 hours per day, five days per week at a mushroom farm. I was not paid the salary that I was promised. Every time I asked for my money, they made some kind of excuse. Even now, after three months of working, I still have not received anything. I would like to return to my wife and children."
