

Dear readers,

2022 was dominated by the war of aggression waged by Russia against Ukraine. When the first refugees started fleeing, the risk of trafficking in human beings, in particular involving women, received substantial attention. Specialised counselling centres responded immediately by going out to arrival points to distribute informa-

tion material and provide advice on the risks of trafficking and the rights as well as available protection for trafficked persons.

The political will that has been demonstrated, combined with remarkable efforts of volunteers and a well-networked, professional civil society response, demonstrate that it is possible to effectively address these challenges.

As a result of the increased focus on refugees from Ukraine, which is crucial at this time, the needs and rights of individuals from other countries seeking protection in Germany have faded into the background. Too little political attention and support was granted to the fact that the specialised counselling centres had to continue providing care and counselling to trafficked persons whilst also facing the challenges resulting from the arrival of refugees from Ukraine. Despite this, the specialised counselling centres have demonstrated incredible dedication.

On the EU Anti-Trafficking Day on 18 October, KOK published its most recent data report. It demonstrates how important the services provided by the specialised counselling centres are for individuals subject to trafficked persons.

Some of our member organisations celebrated anniversaries this year, e.g. FIZ Stuttgart, BBMeZ Bremen and Nadeschda in Herford. For decades now, the specialised counselling centres in the KOK network have been providing essential counselling services for trafficked persons in line with human-rights-oriented quality standards. We are delighted to note that their work is increasingly being recognised as an essential component of combating trafficking in human beings and supporting trafficked persons. Unfortunately, this has not yet been translated into long-term funding of human and financial resources. However, we trust that the German Federal Government will keep its word and remain optimistic about the plans to introduce legislation governing the right to protection from violence.

We thank you for your interest in our work and for your continued support to help us combat trafficking in human beings and enforce human rights.
